

# **Greg D. Perez Annual International Sportfishing Derby**

Each year, around the anniversary of the world record catch, the Foundation hosts an international derby to promote and advance the enjoyment of sportflshing on Guam.

#### **Education**

The Foundation will continue to pursue opportunities to educate and increase awareness of sportflshing.



### **Keeping It Reel**

Greg was a respected sport fisherman who caught a World Record Pacific Blue Marlin weighing 1,153 pounds on August 21, 1969, at the northern end of the island, off Ritidian Point.

This record was held for 13 years, and continues to be the record weight for the Pacific Blue Marlin on Guam and the Marianas.

The original marlin can be found at the Guam Museum, while a replica is displayed in the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport.

### **Gregorio Duenas Perez Marina**

In 1998, the 24th Guam Legislature unanimously voted to rename the Agana Boat Basin to the Gregorio Duenas Perez Marina.

This act by the legislature affirmed how he was remembered and respected by the business, boating, and fishing communities for his skill, respect for the ocean, and generosity.

# How Does Data Flow in Fisheries Management?

The data fishermen share supports every stage of fisheries science and management,

Here are the steps through which the data

flows to support healthy stocks and

sustainable fisheries in the Pacific Islands.

## Collect Data from the Fisheries

Local fishery management agencies collect the data via creel surveys, fish vendor reporting, and life history sampling.

# **Review Data Quality**

Local agency staff reviews the data for accuracy following standardized procedures and transmits the data to the PIFSC FRMD Fisheries Monitoring Program.

## **Archive the Data**

The Fisheries Monitoring Program reviews and archives the data and provides technical support for data entry, retrieval, and reporting.

# Develop Stock Assessments

The fisheries data are reviewed and combined with life history, survey, and/or environmental data to assess the health of the stocks and status of the fisheries.

# Manage the Fisheries

The stock assessments are used to make fishery management decisions to ensure the fisheries are sustainable in the foreseeable future.

### Monitor the Fisheries

The data from fishermen are used to monitor fishery performance relative to the management measures set by fisheries managers




